(Questions with Answers)

1. What are you trying to cure when you drink a glass of water as quickly as you can without taking a breath: insomnia or hiccups?

Answer: Hiccups. There is no scientific proof this works.

2. What is a more common name for the flowering plant antirrhinum, which resembles a mythical fire-breathing creature: daisies or snapdragons?

Answer: Snapdragons. They are indigenous to rocky areas of Europe, North Africa, and the United States.

3. What famous last name do Bette, Jefferson, and Sammy Jr. share: Lansbury or Davis?

Answer: Davis. Bette Davis was an actress. Jefferson Davis was the president of the Confederate States during the American Civil War. Sammy Davis Jr. was a singer and actor.

4. What is the name of the Lone Ranger's sidekick: Trigger or Tonto?

Answer: Tonto. The character Tonto made his debut in the eleventh episode of *The Lone Ranger* radio show in 1933.

5. What brand of cereal uses the mascots Snap, Crackle, and Pop: Frosted Flakes or Rice Krispies?

Answer: Rice Krispies. The mascots' names are an onomatopoeia of what the cereal sounds like in milk.

6. Who was the king of the Greek gods: Jupiter or Zeus?

Answer: Zeus. Jupiter is the leader of the gods in Roman mythology.

7. In what song does the singer say "Goodnight... I'll see you in my dreams": "Mr. Sandman" or "Goodnight, Irene"?

Answer: "Goodnight, Irene." The folk song was first recorded in 1933 by Huddie Ledbetter (also known as Lead Belly).

8. In the nursery rhyme "Hey Diddle Diddle," who ran away with the spoon: the cow or the dish?

Answer: The dish. The rhyme, which was first published around 1765, goes:

Hey, diddle, diddle,
The cat and the fiddle,
The cow jumped over the moon;
The little dog laughed
To see such sport,
And the dish ran away with the spoon.

9. What patriot of the American Revolution is purported as claiming, "The British are coming!": Ben Franklin or Paul Revere?

Answer: Paul Revere. Actually, Revere would have never made this statement, as most of the colonists that he was warning at the time still considered themselves British.

10. What political figurehead in the United Kingdom resides at 10 Downing Street: the queen or the prime minister?

Answer: The prime minister. The queen resides at Buckingham Palace.

11. What doctor participated in the gunfight at the O.K. Corral: Doctor Doolittle or Doc Holiday?

Answer: Doc Holiday. Holiday along with the Earp brothers—Virgil, Morgan, and Wyatt—were the good guys in what is often considered the most famous gunfight in the history of the American Wild West.

12. What comic strip was also the colorful name of Dagwood Bumstead's wife: *Red* or *Blondie*?

Answer: *Blondie*. Did you know that Blondie's maiden name is Boopadoop?

13. According to the lyrics of "Meet Me in St. Louis," where in town is Louis and his girl to meet: at the park or the fair?

Answer: At the fair. And not just any fair—the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair.

14. What ill-fated ocean liner's maiden voyage was also its last when it encountered an iceberg in the North Atlantic Ocean: the SS *Minnow* or the RMS *Titanic*?

Answer: The RMS *Titanic*. British officer and lookout Frederick Fleet was the first to see the iceberg and alert the bridge. His alarm was not in time to save the ship; however, he was one of 705 people to survive.

15. What do Wilson, MacGregor, and Kros-Flite all have in common: they are airplane manufacturers or they are all famous brands of golf balls?

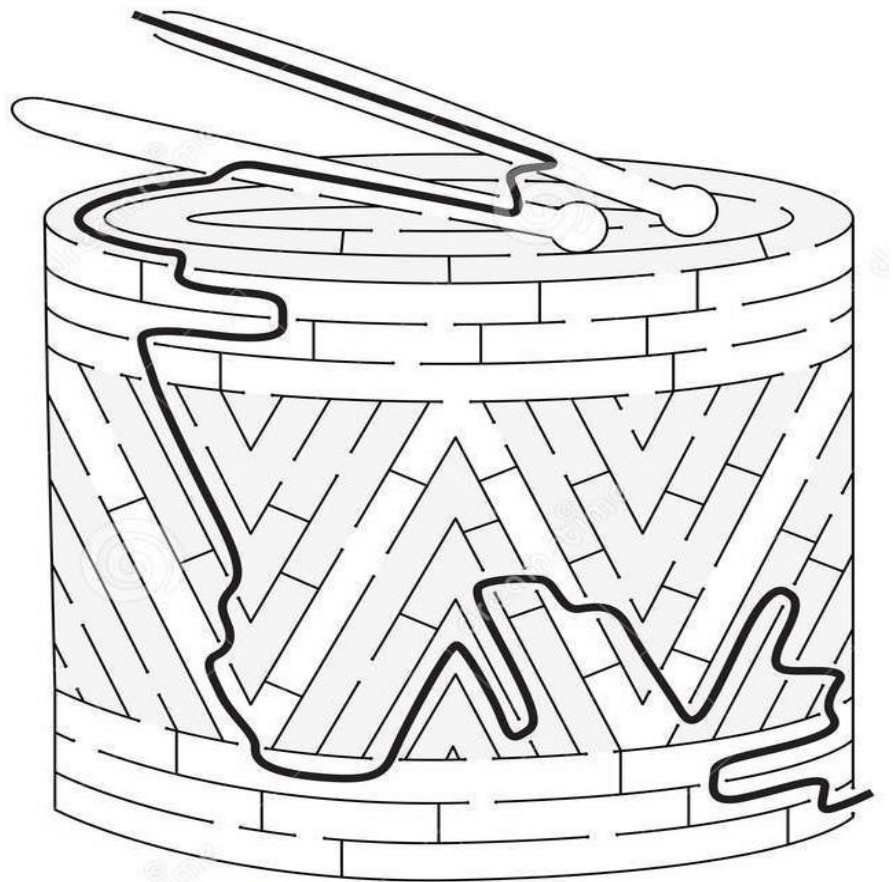
Answer: They are all famous brands of golf balls.
