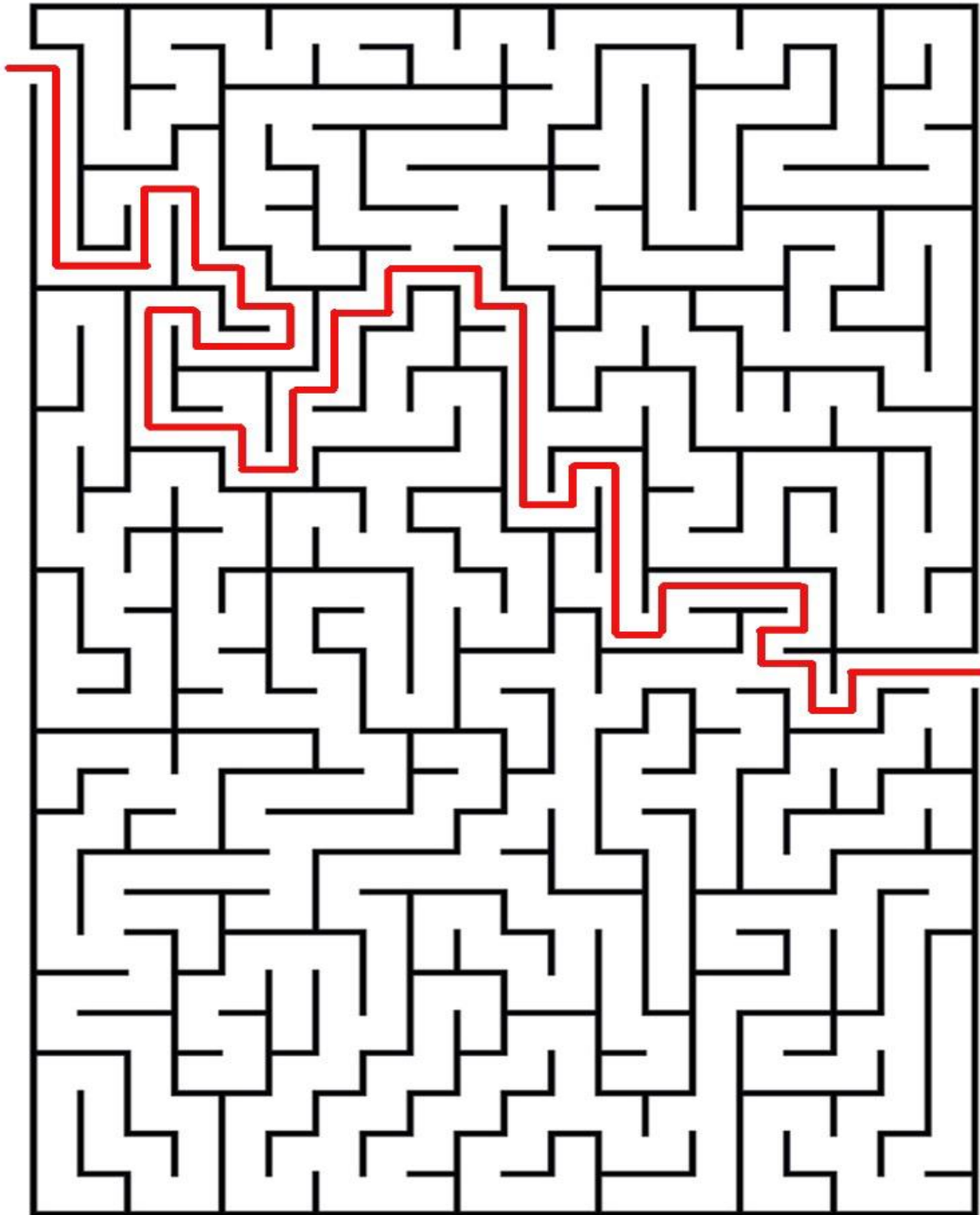
1. (D) All Saints' Day. It occurs on November 1.
